C Your Anonymity (web page)

You registered via the web form

- With your name,
- With your email, and
- With your address

You received a confirmation mail.

So of course, we have your contact data, but we won't share that with anyone else.

C Your Anonymity (contest day)

You need your registration code to join the contest (via CatCoder).

C Your Anonymity (CatCoder)

We have two servers:

- One for the onsite participants (accessible via local LAN/WLAN only)
- One for the Internet participants (<http://catcoder.catalysts.cc>)



You need to register on the respective server.

You can register with minimal details

- User name
- Password

Upon joining the contest

- You specify your participation code
- You specify your programming language (you can switch during the contest if it becomes necessary)



C Your Anonymity (CatCoder)

Upon joining you can also tell us your real name (optional).

During the contest, your user name is visible for all other participants.

So if you want to stay completely anonymous to the other participants, choose a cryptic user name.

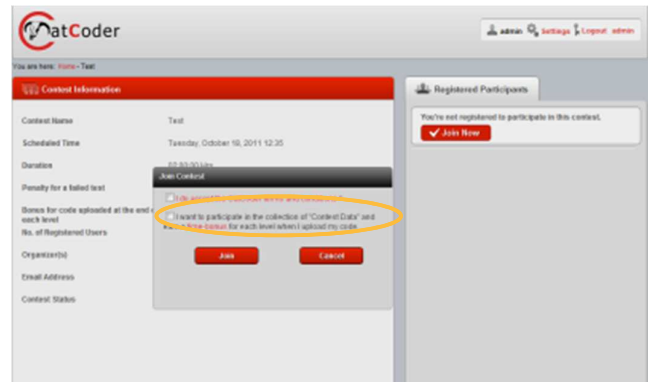
Participate in Collecting Contest Data

When joining the contest, you can select to participate in collecting contest data.

No personal data will be shared, just your user name and the following:

- When you submitted which test results
- When you reached which level
- Your source code (per level)

That data will be made available to agile researches around the globe.



You earn a time bonus at each level when you upload your source code. So prepare your tools (for zipping the source code etc.).

C

Time Bonus / Penalty

You get a **bonus of 2 minutes** when you submit **your source code** at the end of a level.

- If you solve a level by hand, you might upload a text file or a spreadsheet, etc.
- It's completely okay if your source code is not polished.
- So if you can archive and upload your source code in less than 2 minutes, you get ahead of the others.

You get a **penalty of 1 minute** when you submit a **wrong test result**.

- As in previous years, we count each individual (failed) test result and add it up to your number of failed tests.
- So you'd rather be careful with submitting test results, don't just work in "trial & error" mode.

C Determining the Winners

The winner is the first to finish the last level.
Or who comes closest to it.

But:

- We don't just add up the times of each level
- We also subtract the time bonuses for the source code uploads
- We also add the penalties for the failed tests

The fastest 30 people (participating onsite in Vienna) get the prize money.

Unfortunately, we don't have prize money for the online contestants.

C No Internet Connectivity

We provide you with access to our CatCoder (via LAN and WLAN)

- For retrieving the level descriptions
- For retrieving the test cases and submitting your results
- For uploading your source code

We do not provide you with Internet connectivity.
